### Third Team

This year was the first year we implemented Clubs playing Team home games on Tues and Wed to accommodate their ladies days rather than Thursdays. For the most part it seemed to work out okay with a couple of exceptions, when all three teams played a home game on the same day! This created a busy time for the club house and no lady members left to play on Ladies day. I can certainly make sure that with the right schedule this doesn't happen again, however it makes for a scheduling nightmare as I would have to coordinate with First Team's schedule and use appropriate byes. Along with that issue there are a few clubs who have questioned clubs who only have a Third Team resulting in players competing with lower handicaps. With that in mind it appears that certainly one club with only a third team won all its matches soundly. This may be something that gets discussed at the captain's annual meeting on Oct 22, 2018. Along with that issue I have had a request from one club that they could not field a team if they have to play at this particular golf course. This is a very touchy subject; it does not have to do with its members but the golf course specifically. Other clubs may feel the same but have not specially expressed it. Not sure what I can do about this issue. Pitt Meadows have asked to have a third team compete in next year's team play. In reviewing the rules regarding submission of a team there won't be a problem for their club to field an additional team. The Third team plaque will be engraved for the fall meeting.

### 2018 Zone 3 Junior Girls Final Report

2018 was a whirlwind for the junior girls spring tour. The Zone 4 Chair, Stephanie and I collaborated in hosting the spring tour across the lower mainland. We hosted events at Point Grey Golf and Country Club, Quilchena Golf & Country Club, Newlands Golf and Country Club and the Zone championship at the Vancouver Golf Club. Each host club was generous in hosting our events by providing complimentary tee times. This allowed us a larger budget for prizing and food and beverage options for the players.

In terms of the promotional aspect, we used various social media platforms to advertise the events – Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat. Based on Facebook analytics, most of the posts that had the highest number of reaches through the network had to do with the announcement of the schedules and promotion of events. Instagram had the highest number of hits and action compared to the other platforms that we used to promote the junior girls and the tour.

Based on the results and participation, we noticed that most of the events had coincided with MJT and/or CJGA events and most of our top performing girls of our zones had competed in those events. This gave most of the girls in the other handicap divisions the opportunity to compete amongst those in similar level of play and a chance to win a title.

There was lots of feedback from both the players and parents that more events would be beneficial for the girls. To that idea, we feel that we will be hosting a few more events to give the girls an opportunity to compete in a few more events as they prepare for provincial and national championships into the summer.

## FOUR BALL REPORT 2018

Sybil did a great job in searching out courses for this event. Several courses were unable to give us a date, while others turned out to be too expensive, too early in the morning or unable to provide a shotgun start.

What a spectacular sunny, warm day we had for the 2018 Four Ball Tournament at Tsawwassen Springs. We were fortunate to have a shotgun start at 8:30 even though our numbers were only 60. The first two groups started hole 1, while the remainder of the field started on holes 11 to 18.

Posters and information regarding the tournament were out in good time. However, registrations were slow coming in as most players wait until close to the registration deadline to submit their entry.

We had a field of 22 teams from Zone 4 and 8 teams from Zone 3. Prizes were awarded to the Overall Winning Team and Runner-up teams to 5th place.

Prizes were gift certificates from London Drugs, starting at \$100 each for the winners, then 2x\$80, 2x\$70, 2x\$60 and 2x\$50. Two KP and a LD prize were presented. Unfortunately, due to a communication breakdown, only one LD marker had been put out on hole 18, so the prize for the higher handicap group was awarded by a random draw for handicaps 24-36.

The Kay Farrell Cup for 2018 was awarded to the team of Anne Kordyback and Moira Milligan from Tsawwassen Springs Business Women with a best net score of 62.

Thanks to the volunteers who helped with registration and scoring. Special thanks to Rules Chair Bernice, who managed things on the course all on her own. Pace of Play was between 4 and 4 ½ hours. Bernice handled the one incident caused by the over-zealous course Marshall who panicked the Pro shop into thinking our players were going to be out there for 6 hours. Bernice had all the right answers for them and kept encouraging players to keep up to the groups in front. Unfortunately it led to a bit of pressure put on one group who did a fabulous job in catching up. It was not due to slow play, but to the way the groups were positioned on the course. One player had to be disqualified for practicing her chipping on the 10<sup>th</sup> green prior to the beginning of the round. When told at the end of the round, she accepted the ruling and admitted that she just didn't think.

The players appeared to enjoy their lunch especially the Butternut Squash soup and were happy that prizes were distributed in a timely fashion so they could beat the rush hour traffic to get home.

## **2018 SENIOR “TEAM” CHAMPIONSHIP REPORT**

**08 September 2018**

Because we had struggled over the last few years to get 40 ladies to register for our SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIP, we took it to the membership at last year’s Spring Captains’ Meeting to come up with a new format. We decided to go with the last week in August rather than the 3rd week in September. As the 2018 Zone 3 Senior Champion had already been decided at the AM-SR Zone 3 – 4 Tournament in May, we decided to go with a TEAM format.

With the number of Opens, Invitationals, Team Play, Club Championships and League Matches scheduled for August, that decision was totally wrong.
